

Call for the selection by examinations of 60 places in the first year of the first level undergraduate course and for 22 places in the first year of the second level undergraduate course of the Scuola Normale Superiore for the academic year 2026-2027

Art. 1. Places available

- 1.1 The Scuola Normale Superiore (SNS) announces for the academic year 2026-2027 a selection by examinations for:
- a) **28** places in the first year of the first level undergraduate course and **4** places in the first year of the second level undergraduate courses at the Faculty of Humanities (Pisa);
 - b) **32** places in the first year of the first level undergraduate course and **6** places in the first year of the second level undergraduate course at the Faculty of Sciences (Pisa);
 - c) **6** places in the first year of the second level undergraduate course at the Faculty of Sciences (Pisa) reserved for those attending the master's degree course in "Materials and Nanotechnology" at the University of Pisa;
 - d) **6** places in the first year of the second level undergraduate course at the Faculty of Political and Social Sciences (Florence).
 - e) The number of places may be increased, by subsequent provision to be published before the start of the tests, should additional financial and/or logistical resources become available after publication of the call herein.
- 1.2 Scholarships for attendance of the undergraduate course have a duration of:
- a) five years for successful applicants for the first year of the first level undergraduate course;
 - b) two years for successful applicants for the first year of the second level undergraduate course.
- 1.3 Those admitted to the Faculty of Humanities are required to enrol at the University of Pisa and simultaneously attend an undergraduate degree course or a master's degree course from the "Humanities disciplines" area, chosen based on their undergraduate course of reference at the SNS, as indicated in the following table:

- 1.4 Those admitted to the Faculty of Sciences are required to enrol at the University of Pisa and simultaneously attend an undergraduate degree course or a master's degree course from the "Mathematical, physical and natural sciences" ("Scienze matematiche, fisiche e della natura") area, chosen based on their undergraduate course of reference at the SNS, as indicated in the following table:

- 1.5 Those admitted to the Faculty of Political and Social Sciences are required to enrol at the University of Florence and simultaneously attend a master's degree course of the Scuola di Scienze Politiche "Cesare Alfieri", from among those indicated in the following table.

- 1.6 Successful applicants intending to enrol in limited access degree courses of the University of Pisa will have reserved places and will thus not have to take any entrance tests required by the university regulations.
- 1.7 Admission to the undergraduate courses of the Scuola Normale Superiore is not compatible with the "Fondazione articolo 34" scholarship, pursuant to Art. 1, paragraphs 273-289, of Law No. 232 of 11th December 2016.

Art. 2. Admission requirements

- 2.1 All those who, regardless of their nationality, are in possession of the following requirements qualify for inclusion in the call:

- **for the places in the first year of the first level undergraduate course:**

- a) all those who attained a qualification giving access to degree courses at Italian universities not before the academic year 2024-2025 or who undertake to attain such a qualification by 30th September 2026;
- b) all those who did not enrol, prior to the academic year 2026-2027, in any of the following three-year course classes:

- c) all those who have not attended, prior to the academic year 2026-2027, any degree courses at non-Italian universities equivalent to those listed in the previous paragraph.

The commissions will assess applicants' admissibility based on the declarations provided, in order to avoid any positions of advantage resulting from an applicant's having already attended, even in part, any university courses at the level for which he or she is applying;

- for the places in the first year of the second level undergraduate course:

- a) all those who attained the first qualification that gives access to a master's degree course not before 1st November 2024, or have committed to attain it by 31st December 2026, under penalty of forfeiture of the place;
- b) all those who were not enrolled prior to the academic year 2026-2027 in any of the following master's degree classes:

c) those who have not attended, prior to the academic year 2026-2027, degree courses at foreign universities equivalent to those listed in the previous paragraph.

The commissions will assess applicants' admissibility based on the declarations provided, in order to avoid any positions of advantage resulting from an applicant's having already attended, even in part, any university courses at the level for which he or she is applying;

2.2 The following applicants will be excluded from taking part in the competition:

a) those who have been subject to the disciplinary action of "definitive expulsion" as specified by Article 31 of the teaching regulations of the SNS;

b) those who have past convictions of imprisonment for three years or more.

2.3 Applicants shall be admitted on a provisional basis and may be excluded at any moment from the admissions process should they fail to meet any of the requirements.

2.4 The SNS reserves the right to check at any time, even after the announcement of the successful applicants, the truthfulness of the statements made in the application and the possession of the prescribed requirements. Failure to meet the requirements will lead to exclusion from the admissions process, or, if ascertained after the winners are nominated, the loss of the place. The reasons for exclusion or revocation will be communicated in writing to the address indicated on the application form.

2.5 In addition to the requirements of the preceding paragraphs, applicants must have a sufficient knowledge of Italian to enable them to successfully take part in the courses.

Art. 3. Preselection via TOLC test for access to the written tests for admission to the first year of the first level undergraduate course of the Faculty of Sciences

3.1 For admission to the written tests, those applying for places in the first year of the first level undergraduate course of the Faculty of Sciences must prove that they have taken a TOLC test, which is administered by the Consorzio Interuniversitario Sistemi Integrati per l'Accesso (the University Consortium of Integrated Access Systems) (CISIA) and can be taken in any form and at any university site subscribing to CISIA. The test must be taken starting from 1s February 2026 and by 29th July 2026.

3.2 Applicants for the first year of the first level undergraduate course applying for the disciplinary areas of "Mathematics and Information Technology", "Physics" and "Chemistry and Geology" will need to take the TOLC S test, and those applying for the disciplinary area of "Biological sciences" will need to take the TOLC B test.

3.3 Admission to the written tests will be granted to the 240 applicants with the highest scores; the total number will be divided between the two disciplinary groups (area S: "Mathematics and Information Technology", "Physics" and "Chemistry and Geology"; area B: "Biological Sciences") proportionately to the number of applications received per group. Within each of the two groups, the applicants with the best scores will be selected.

- 3.4 The compiling of the classification of the 240 applicants with the highest scores will not take into consideration the results of the section relating to competence in the English language.
- 3.5 For details about the TOLC tests and their regulation (mode of delivery, assessments, repeatability of the tests) please refer to the "Regolamento TOLC" ("TOLC Regulations"), which can be consulted on the CISIA web site. To enrol in the TOLC tests and to check available dates, please go to the calendario (timetable) present on the CISIA web site.
- 3.6 For applicants who have taken more than one TOLC test, the SNS will take into consideration the test with the highest score.
- 3.7 The overall number of those effectively admitted to the tests may be higher than indicated in the table in the case of *ex aequo* scores.
- 3.8 The result of the TOLC test is valid only for admission to the competition tests and does not contribute to the formation of the final classification.
- 3.9 Since the TOLC S and B tests are not administered by the CISIA Consortium in English, non-Italian applicants who have obtained the qualification required for admission to the call abroad and who in their application indicate English for the written and oral tests (or French for the Faculty of Humanities) are exonerated from taking the TOLC test referred to in this article, and will be admitted to the written tests in excess. It is, however, indispensable that the qualification possessed by applicants be recognised as valid by the University of Pisa and the University of Florence for enrolment in degree courses.

Art. 4. Applications and deadlines

- 4.1 Applications for the call, which can be filled out in Italian or English, must be registered online by 2 p.m. Italian time on **Thursday, 30th July 2026**, through the online procedure as indicated on the dedicated page of the SNS web site.
- 4.2 All applications received after the stipulated date and time will be rejected whatever the cause of delay. Applicants are strongly advised to check that they have received the e-mail notification of the registration of their application and the relative ID number (*prematricola*); the SNS is not responsible for incorrectly completed application procedures.

The SNS cannot accept responsibility for any malfunctioning due to technical problems, overloading of the communication line and/or the application systems; applicants are therefore advised not to wait for the last few days before the deadline before submitting their application.

The SNS is not responsible for communications that go astray on account of incorrect indications of address in the application on the part of applicants, tardy notification of change of the address indicated in the application, or errors ascribed to third parties, accidental circumstances or force majeure.

- 4.3 Applicants who are non-EU citizens will need to submit to the Italian consulate of their country an application for pre-enrolment at the University of Pisa or the University of Florence, by the deadline to be specified by the provisions of the Ministero dell'Università e della Ricerca (the Ministry of Universities and Research) (MUR) relating to the enrolment of overseas students for the academic year 2026-2027.
- 4.4 The SNS reserves the right to allow the regularisation of applications submitted on time but resulting as irregular owing to remediable errors.
- 4.5 In their application, applicants must declare the following, in compliance with Article No. 46 of President of the Republic's Decree No. 445, dated 28th December 2000, called "Legislative provisions relating to administrative documents", and subsequent amendments and additions thereto:
- a) their name, surname, place and date of birth and tax code;
 - b) their nationality;
 - c) their residency; address if different from that of residency; telephone number and e-mail address to receive communications;
 - d) that they have not been sentenced to imprisonment lasting three years or more;
 - e) that they have not undergone the disciplinary measure of "expulsion" from the SNS;
 - f) an educational qualification valid for admission to the call, the school or university from which it was obtained and the date of graduation;
 - g) the faculty, disciplinary area and undergraduate course level (first or second) for which they are competing;
 - h) for applications for the first year of the first level undergraduate course, any enrolments in degree courses in Italy or abroad prior to the academic year 2026-2027, specifying the denomination, faculty (for those who had enrolled in Italian universities), department and university of enrolment; for those who had registered overseas, the study plan must be attached;
 - i) for applications for the first year of the second level undergraduate course, any enrolments in a master's degree course in Italy or abroad prior to the academic year 2026/27, specifying the denomination, faculty (for those who had enrolled in Italian universities), department and university of enrolment; those who had enrolled in a university abroad must attach their study plan;

- j) the undergraduate or master's degree course in which they intend to enrol at the University of Pisa or the University of Florence;
- k) that they are aware of the admissions process regulations and accept them, without reservation;
- l) that they are aware of the information concerning the processing of personal data referred to in Art.10 of the call herein;
- m) if, in accordance with Article 20 of Law No. 104, dated 5th February 1992, "Framework Law for the assistance, social integration and rights of disabled people", they wish to take advantage of assistance and extra time to take the tests;
- n) if, in accordance with Law No. 170, dated 8th October 2010 and subsequent modifications thereto, regarding specific learning disabilities resulting from valid certification issued no later than five years previously by the SSN (the Italian national health system) or by specialists or structures recognised by the latter, they wish to take advantage of assistance and extra time to take the tests;
- o) if they wish to observe the Sabbatical rest, in accordance with Art. 4, third paragraph, of Law No. 101, dated 8th March 1989, "Legislation for the regulation of relations between the State and the joint Italian Jewish communities";
- p) any tests that they intend to take in a different language from Italian, in accordance with the specifications of the article 5.9 below.

- 4.6 Applicants may submit applications for one Faculty only and, within each Faculty, for one subject only.
- 4.7 Applicants must also indicate the subject in which they intend to take the tests, with reference to the Information regarding the tests ("Test overview"), attached to the call herein and constituting an integral and substantial part thereof.
- 4.8 Applicants are required to indicate the tests that they intend to take, where appropriate.

Art. 5. Test conduct procedures

- 5.1 The competition tests are intended to assess the candidates' preparation, talent, motivation and the potential of their cultural and professional development. The tests are both written and oral.
- 5.2 By **Wednesday 5th August 2026** the list of candidates admitted to the written tests will be published on the [dedicated page](#) of the SNS web site in anonymised version with the ID number assigned to the submitted application (*prematricola*).
- 5.3 All candidates admitted to the written tests are required to be present, without the need for further communications, at the location that will be indicated as outlined in the following paragraph.
- 5.4 Together with the list of applicants admitted, the indications as to the location where the tests are to be held, their duration, the procedures for carrying them out and any formalities required to access the test location will be published on the SNS website.
- 5.5 Applicants must attend all the tests with a valid identity card or equivalent document. In carrying out the written tests, the applicants must strictly observe, under penalty of exclusion from the competition,

the indications published on the SNS website in accordance with the fourth paragraph of this article, as well as any further instructions received from the call commission during the tests. Any changes will be announced in the same way; the SNS, however, reserves the right to use different means of communication when opportune.

- 5.6 The timetable of the oral tests and the list of the admitted candidates, with an indication of the average score in the written tests, will be published on the SNS official online register and on the [dedicated page](#) of the SNS website. The inclusion in the list of admitted candidates is equivalent to a notification to the persons concerned, who are thus expected to attend without the need for further communications.
- 5.7 The list of the scores achieved by all candidates in the written tests will be published in the same section of the SNS website; the scores will be reported anonymously and will be associated with the ID number corresponding to that assigned to the submitted application.
- 5.8 The absence of a candidate at the start of any one of the tests, whatever the cause, including force majeure, will entail his or her exclusion from the selection process.
- 5.9 The tests may be taken in the following languages:
- Faculty of Humanities: Italian, French or English.
 - Faculty of Sciences: Italian or English.
 - Faculty of Political and Social Sciences: Italian or English.
- 5.10 The call commissions reserve the right to verify during the oral test that a candidate's level of knowledge of Italian is sufficient to ensure his or her participation in the activities envisaged in the course.
- 5.11 In the event of impediments ensuing from a state of emergency, changes may be made, with a specific director's decree, relating to the modes of conducting the competition; adequate notice of such changes will be given.

Art. 6. Call commissions, scores, ranking

- 6.1 The commissions may delegate some of their activities to sub-commissions. Admission to the oral tests and the definition of the final rankings are decided in a plenary session. For the carrying out and correction of the tests, the commissions may decide to call upon the additional skills and contributions of lecturers, researchers, graduate students and experts appointed for the purpose by the Director of the SNS.
- 6.2 For the assessment of each of the written tests, the commissions can award a maximum score of one hundred points.
- 6.3 Those candidates are admitted to the oral tests who in the written tests attain an average of at least:
- seventy points for the places of the Faculty of Humanities,
 - sixty points for the places of the Faculty of Sciences; in calculating this average, for candidates for the first year of the first level undergraduate course, the commission will attribute a weight of

60% to the written test relating to the subject for which the candidate is competing and a weight of 40% to the written test relating to the other subject ;

- sixty points for the places of the Faculty of Political and Social Sciences.

6.4 Oral tests are successfully passed by candidates who attain an average of at least:

- seventy points for the places of the Faculty of Humanities;
- sixty points for the places of the Faculty of Sciences;
- sixty points for the places of the Faculty of Political and Social Sciences.

6.5 Upon conclusion of the selection process, the results obtained by candidates in the oral tests will be published on the SNS official online register and on the [dedicated page](#) of the SNS website.

6.6 Candidates who have passed both written and oral tests will be declared as qualifying for admission.

6.7 The commissions, considering the average of the marks obtained by each candidate in the written and oral tests, will formulate the final ranking of the candidates in order of merit.

6.8 If two or more candidates have the same score at the end of the selection process, the youngest candidate will be placed higher in the ranking.

6.9 The official rankings will be published on the SNS online register and on the [dedicated page](#) on the SNS web site.

6.10 The SNS will notify only the winners of the result of the competition.

6.11 The proceedings of the competition procedure are accessible in accordance with Law No. 241 of 7th August 1990, subsequent to the publication of the rankings referred to in paragraph 6.9. Requests can be submitted according to the indications available on the [dedicated page](#).

Art. 7. Contribution to travel and accommodation expenses

7.1 The SNS provides free accommodation, in its own student residences or in affiliated facilities, to candidates taking the written exams whose 2026 ISEE (Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator) is below 35,000 Euros and who reside more than 100 kilometres away from the exam venues. Interested candidates who meet the aforementioned requirements may submit a request using the online form available on the dedicated web page, once they have submitted their application to participate in the competition and within the deadline set for applications. The 2026 family ISEE certificate must be attached, and the dates for which accommodation is required must be specified.

7.2 The SNS will confirm the assignment of accommodation after the publication of the list of admitted candidates, and in due time for the exams, based on availability and the chronological order of the requests received. Accommodation will be provided in a double or single room, depending on availability.

7.3 For candidates residing at a distance between 100 and 400 kilometres from the exam venues, accommodation will be provided exclusively for the night preceding each exam.

- 7.4 Candidates residing at a distance greater than 400 kilometres from the exam venues, or in Sardinia/Sicily, or abroad, will be allowed to stay in the SNS facilities during the period between the night preceding the first exam and the night preceding the second exam.
- 7.5 Candidates who have been assigned accommodation and who intend to withdraw from the written exams are required to promptly inform the SNS and in any case no later than August 16.
- 7.6 For information on the accommodation request procedure, you may contact alloggi.concorso@sns.it.
- 7.7 Should accommodation for candidates who meet the requirements referred to in the previous paragraph not be available in SNS residences or in affiliated facilities, the SNS may grant a reimbursement for external accommodation expenses, up to 50.00 Euros per night, upon presentation of the relevant supporting documents (receipts). Candidates residing at a distance between 100 and 400 kilometres from the SNS will receive the contribution for accommodation expenses for the night preceding each exam. Candidates residing at a distance greater than 400 kilometres from the SNS, or in Sardinia/Sicily, or abroad, may receive the contribution for accommodation expenses for the period between the night preceding the first exam and the night preceding the second exam.
- 7.8 The SNS grants candidates admitted to the oral exams who meet the financial requirements referred to in paragraph 1 the reimbursement of accommodation expenses, up to 50.00 Euros per night, upon presentation of the relevant supporting documents. Reimbursement will be provided exclusively for the night preceding each exam.
- 7.9 The SNS grants candidates who meet the financial requirements referred to in paragraph 1 the reimbursement of travel expenses for participation in the written exams, applying a deductible of 50.00 Euros and an overall maximum ceiling of 350.00 Euros for residents in Italy and 700.00 Euros for residents abroad. This is subject to the submission, via the specific online form, of the 2026 ISEE indicator and electronic copies of the relevant expense receipts. For candidates residing at a distance greater than 400 kilometres from the SNS, or in Sardinia/Sicily, or abroad, and for those who choose to stay in the SNS facilities for a period exceeding two nights, only the reimbursement of one round-trip journey between their place of residence and the SNS will be recognized.
- 7.10 The SNS grants candidates admitted to the oral exams the reimbursement of travel expenses, applying a deductible of 50.00 Euros and a maximum ceiling of 350.00 Euros for residents in Italy and 700.00 Euros for residents abroad, upon submission, via the specific online form, of the 2026 ISEE indicator and electronic copies of the relevant expense receipts.
- 7.11 The requirements and methods for reimbursement referred to in the preceding paragraphs 2, 3, 4, and 5 are outlined in Annex 1.
- 7.12 The request forms for the reimbursement of expenses referred to in the previous paragraphs will be made available on the SNS website in the section dedicated to the competition. Reimbursement requests (one for accommodation expenses and one for travel expenses) must be submitted by October 31, 2026, together with a declaration stating that no request for reimbursement for the same expenses has been submitted to any other entity.

Art. 8. Nomination of the winners

- 8.1 The Director of the SNS will approve the final rankings and will designate the successful candidates, depending on the number of places available.
- 8.2 Successful candidates must be present at the start of the course at the SNS in Pisa for the Faculty of Humanities or the Faculty of Sciences, or at the SNS in Florence for the Faculty of Political and Social Sciences; the start date is announced in the notice of assignment. Otherwise, unless a prior request with a motivation recognised as valid by the SNS is submitted, candidates will forfeit their place.
- 8.3 In the case of refusal or forfeiture of a place, the SNS reserves the right to proceed to a new assignment within thirty days from the start of the courses, with reference to the ranking of the successful candidates.
- 8.4 Successful candidates must provide the SNS, by the deadline that will be communicated to them, with the following documents:
- a) a statement of enrolment in a valid undergraduate or master's degree course at the University of Pisa or the University of Florence;
 - b) a declaration of acceptance of the Statute of the SNS and its regulations, exonerating the SNS from the consequences of non-compliance. For any successful candidates that are still minors, the declaration must be made by a parent or a legal guardian;
 - c) a digital photograph;
 - d) for degrees attained abroad, the submission of a certificate issued by the issuing institute or university; certificates must be translated into Italian, with the exception of those in French, English, Spanish or German;
 - e) a health certificate on unstamped paper stating any diseases preventing participation in the everyday life of a community, dated within the last three months;
- 8.5 The SNS reserves the right to carry out further checks and to request further certifications, where permitted by law, for the purposes of compliance with the obligations referred to in paragraph 9.5 below regarding exemption from the university taxes.

Art. 9. Students' rights and obligations

- 9.1 The status of undergraduate student is regulated by the Statute and the internal regulations of the SNS.
- 9.2 Attendance at the SNS is free of charge. Students of the undergraduate course have the obligation to reside at the site of their course, in the colleges of the SNS, which are free of charge.
- 9.3 Successful candidates for places in the first year of the second level undergraduate course in Pisa will be allotted places in the SNS residences subject to the number of accommodations available. As an exception to the rule expressed in the last paragraph, those who will not be assigned lodgings within the residences will have the right to reside outside the colleges and will be guaranteed adequate lodgings in other structures or else will be paid, for the academic year 2026-2027, a special accommodation grant of € 460,00 a month, subject, for taxation purposes, to the prevailing Italian legislation regarding scholarships.

- 9.4 From the 1st October to the 30th September of the following year, with the exclusion of academic holiday periods, students of the undergraduate course benefit from free board at the SNS canteen or in affiliated facilities. In addition, they receive an all-inclusive scholarship the amount of which is determined each year by the SNS, and the reimbursement, total or partial, of university fees paid to the University of Pisa or the University of Florence.
- 9.5 The scholarship for 2026-2027 is determined based on the ISEE, in accordance with the diagram reported in Annex 2; the scholarship is subject, for tax purposes, to the prevailing Italian legislation regarding scholarships.
- 9.6 Undergraduate students may be allowed, for serious reasons, to suspend their academic activities, for a maximum of 12 months during their whole academic career. Suspension for maternity or for any other obligations covered by legislation is permitted subject to students' informing the SNS of their situation.
- 9.7 Undergraduate students may not take on any commitments that are considered by the SNS to be incompatible with the proper fulfilment of their academic obligations at the Normale.
- 9.8 To be admitted to subsequent years, undergraduate students must:
- a) follow courses at both the SNS and their University of reference;
 - b) attend interviews and examinations according to a study plan submitted by them and approved by their Faculty;
 - c) qualify for eligibility on the basis of yearly interviews and take all university and internal exams in accordance with their study plan;
 - d) achieve a grade of not less than twenty-four out of thirty in exams taken at the University and the SNS and maintain an average of at least twenty-seven out of thirty.
- 9.9 Any requests to pass to an undergraduate course different from that chosen during the application process may be submitted by students in accordance with the indications of the prevailing [Guidelines](#).

Art. 10. Processing of personal data

- 10.1 The candidates' personal data processing is governed by Legislative Decree Number 196 of 30 June 2003 (Code for the protection of personal data) and EU Regulation 2016/79 regarding the protection of personal data.
- 10.2 The Data Controller for the personal data provided by the data subjects is the Scuola Normale Superiore, a state university institute, located in Piazza dei Cavalieri, 7 Pisa - 56126, in the person of its Director and *pro tempore* legal representative.
- 10.3 The person responsible for the protection of personal data (RPD or DPO) may be contacted at the e-mail address dpo@sns.it.
- 10.4 Personal data will be collected by the SNS as part of the selection/admission procedure of candidates and processed for the completion of the said procedure and, for the successful candidates, for the subsequent management of their career at the SNS and for all related activities.

- 10.5 Personal data are processed to perform tasks of public interest and in any case linked to the exercising of its public powers, including the purposes of archiving, historical research and analysis for statistical purposes. Personal data will be processed, also with automated tools (software and databases administered by the SNS and hosted by the CINECA contracting entities), in compliance with the principles of accountability, lawfulness, correctness, minimisation, transparency, integrity, accuracy, confidentiality and proportionality.
- 10.6 The personal data collected will be communicated to third parties (public and/or private parties) in the context of institutional relations, for the fulfilment of legal obligations, regulations or contracts, relevant to the services required by the SNS (placements, tutoring, access to facilities, etc.). The personal data collected may be communicated or transferred to parties established in third countries only if suitable data protection guarantees and conditions have been ascertained.
- 10.7 The personal data collected will be published on the SNS official online register and on the SNS website in the cases foreseen by the law and by SNS regulations. The personal data collected will be processed and stored for the time strictly necessary to achieve the purposes for which they have been collected, without prejudice to legislation applying to the storage of documentation by public institutions.
- 10.8 Data subjects may exercise the following rights at any moment:
- access to their personal data, in the cases and with the procedures pursuant to Art. 15 of the Regulations;
 - the rectification, erasure or restriction of the processing of their personal data, in the cases and with the procedures pursuant to Articles 16-18 of the Regulations; erasure is not permitted for data included in the documents that the SNS is obliged to keep;
 - the portability of data, in the cases and with the procedures pursuant to Art. 20 of the Regulations;
 - objection to the processing of data, in the cases and with the procedures under Article 21 of the Regulations;
 - the right to submit a complaint to the Italian Data Protection Authority (Garante Privacy).

Art. 11. Final and referral provisions and information
